Overnight Call Schedule (PGY-2 and PGY-3s only)

Evanston, Glenbrook Skokie 2 nights per block on floor rotations. 4 overnight calls in the ICU at Glenbrook. No overnight call.

Night Float (Evanston and Glenbrook only)

4-6 weeks per year, 7pm to 7am.

Handles admissions and cross coverage 5-6 days per week on Medicine floors.

PGY-2 and PGY-3 residents have a 2-week block of ICU night float at Glenbrook.

Caps

PGY-1:

5 new admissions in 24 hours or a total census of 10 patients.

PGY-2/3:

10 new admissions in 24 hours or a total census of 20 patients.

1 block = 4 weeks; Schedule is subject to change to maintain compliance with ACGME requirements.
*3-4 floor months, and 2-4 weeks of night float are at Glenbrook Hospital and 0-1 floor months are at Skokie Hospital
