GET SCREENED

Lung Cancer Screening CT

NorthShore University HealthSystem now offers screening with low-dose computed tomography (CT) for people at high risk for lung cancer, the only recommended screening test for the disease.

Who should be screened?

- Ages 55 to 77
- Smoking history equivalent of one pack a day for at least 30 years
- Current smokers or individuals who have quit within the last 15 years

What does the screening include?

- 30-minute visit with a NorthShore physician to provide information about the screening and to determine eligibility
- Low-dose CT scan
- Follow-up testing and personalized plan based on the results of the CT scan

How do I make an appointment?

If you have a NorthShore primary care physician, contact him/her to schedule a lung cancer screening appointment to discuss OR call 224-251-LUNG (5864).

RESEARCH AND CLINICAL TRIALS

The NCI-MATCH study, EAY131

Patients with the same type and stage of cancer usually receive the same cancer treatments but can respond differently to these treatments. In learning more about cancer, researchers have discovered that genetic changes in a patient's tumor may cause the cancer to grow.

This is a phase II clinical trial that will help researchers learn whether study drugs targeting certain genetic changes in cancer cells can be effective in treating cancer.

The study will assign, or "match", you to a specific cancer treatment based on whether certain genetic changes are found in your tumor. The tests done on your tumor to find out if you have genetic changes are investigational. If your tumor has genetic changes that match one of the study drugs being studied in the trial, you may be eligible to take part.
