Not to be missed will be the fashion show on Saturday, August 27 at 2 p.m. Wearables from ACE— clothing, jewelry, handbags and other accessories—will be modeled on our runway. All of the creative, fine quality items are, of course, available at the show for sale!

This year's raffle prize has been donated by our presenting sponsor Kalamazoo Outdoor Gourmet. The Artisan Fire Pizza Oven is valued at \$6,500 and is a work of art in itself. Delivering great
